> The Pace of Play Suggestions below can help prevent slow play...

- Plan your shot while walking to your ball or while others are playing.
- Line up your putt when others are putting and be ready to play when it is your turn.
- Be ready to play when it is your turn.
- Walk briskly between shots.
- Walk directly to your golf ball; don't follow others unless assisting in a search.
- If riding, take several clubs with you to your ball so you won't have to walk back to the cart.
- Don't step off or measure yardage for every single golf shot develop an "eye" for distance.
- Be efficient with pre-shot routine.
- Take only one practice swing.
- Play a provisional ball if you think the original might be lost outside a water hazard or out of bounds.
- Leave your clubs on the side of the putting green towards the next tee.

Superintendent's Notes

....From Wade Toeplitz

I hope you all have had the best of holidays and your new year be even better! It's been great for me, my family and Webb Hill. The amount of traffic the clubhouse has this time of year just amazes me. Scott and the clubhouse truly know how to take care of our members and guest. They deserve some down time after the endless amount of work they've put onto these holiday parties. I also have to recognize the grounds crew who gave it their all this season. They all have a passion for Webb Hill and making it better each and every day.

As I said last time, we have the greatest membership possible. Our fundraiser for "Cover the Turf" turned out better than expected. Donations were more than generous again and we have covers and sand bags set out and ready in case an event is expected. Thank you all so much for battling it out on that cold windy day. And an extra special thank you to Pete Haayen for making this happen. Covers will be used if the temperature is going to get to 25 degrees or below freezing for an extended amount of time. We will have to monitor the weather and install covers early if heavy wind is expected. That could mean a day or two early.

Winter cleanup is still in the process. Leaf cleanup is a slow go as well as anything else on the course due to all the much needed rain and the leaves are still holding on. Once leaves and trees are done we will turn our attention to some much needed concrete repair. Several of the trees to be trimmed or dropped are in the line of fire of golfers so we are being strategic about that and will jump on it when the time is right. You've probably noticed a few areas we don't clean. The reason is to slow the water down before running across some fairways. It has washed several fairways over the years and deposited several inches of silt. Causing hard lines, washed areas and heads several inches below the surface.

I ask you all to keep in mind frost delays or playability of the course this time of year. With the amount of rain we've had most days have been cart path only. The course does not dry easily now and any traffic or ruts will be visible till spring or maybe even summer. We will tend to keep more of an eye out for these situations in the winter time. What we save now will improve summer playability.

Golf handicaps will be billed in February for \$35. This is what the Texas Golf Association charges Webb Hill. If you are on this list and need to be taken off, please contact the golf shop. If you are not on the list and wish to be added, let us know. This service provides you with updated handicaps every three weeks and gives you the opportunity to go online to check your handicap (with up to the date handicap) anytime you wish. You may also bring in any scorecards from any other course to be posted. Notify the golf shop of any changes that need to be made.
